Cumberland County Workforce Development Center Summer Youth Employment

FACT SHEET

The Cumberland County Workforce Development Center promotes the Summer Youth Employment Program by helping youth to develop quality life skills. Youth perform work while earning money and acquiring a valuable job experience. The program seeks to develop good work habits and to stress both education and experience as a prerequisite to a successful future.

The Cumberland County Workforce Development Center (WDC) will make 100 – 150 jobs available to program participants. Selected youth will work 35 hours per week.

When does the program begin?

Participant will begin work on July 6, 2010.

How long does it last?

The last day of work will be on August 13, 2010.

How much will I earn?

The starting pay will be \$7.25 per hour.

Who can participate in the program?

The Summer Youth Program is designed for individuals who are rising juniors or seniors in high school, high school dropouts, high school graduates and post-secondary students up to the age of 21. Applicants must live in Cumberland County, meet the eligibility requirements and have one barrier. (Not available for visiting relatives during the summer)

Where will I work?

Participants will be placed with non-profit, governmental agencies, Cumberland County School system, and private employers throughout Cumberland County.

How do I apply?
